### Ministry A: MANGYAN CHILDREN & YOUTH DEVELOPMENT MISSION

## B. MINISTRY BENEFICIARIES/PARTICIPANTS

We minister 24 hours daily to nineteen (19) Mangyan Children in our Mission Center on the start of classes last June. However, before the end of the first grading period, two Mangyan kids were already disqualified, namely, Rhea and Emer; because they failed to obey rules in our mission center for many times. Among the 17 Mangyan children now in our ministry, four of them are first timers in our mission center. They are Ethel, Abel, Minda and Arnold.

Below are the Tekno Kids updates :

1. Jessa, Michael, Meraly, Esmael, and Joseph – are fast learners this time according to their Tutor. They could memorize Scripture easily. They are potential leaders. Joseph is good in math. Meraly find it hard to read English.
2. Arnold, Edmund, Rocky and Abel – are slow learners and need to spend more time with their Tutor. They could hardly memorize Scripture but they are trying their best.
3. Margie, Minda, Laila, Ethel and Leny – are trying harder and coping in their training and studies.
4. Maribel, Lilibeth – still struggle as first year high schoolers
5. Melia – is trying her best to study as she is graduating in high school. She found it hard this time to memorize Scripture.
6. Melia, Maribel, Lilibeth and Minda – act as leaders
7. Angelyn – in Bible School is facing some peer pressures, pls. pray for her.

In our Feeding Program, we include eight more Mangyan kids during lunch time, the 7 Grade 1 and 1 male high school. Hence, we give food to 25 Mangyan Children daily.

These 17 Mangyan Children, for several years at tekno Center, are still adjusting in our trainings for them. Generally, they did not undergo much discipline in their homes. Ministering to them is really a hard continuing long process and with much repetitions.

We need younger and energetic Christian Workers to serve/minister to the Mangyan Children.

## TESTIMONIES ( as translated in English)

1. **Melia, 4<sup>TH</sup> year high school** – *“God gave me wisdom in my studies this first grading period. I passed our examinations. It’s an answered prayer! God gave me also courage to speak in front of our English class, my teacher was glad that I did. He answered also my request to have a new slippers. Thank be to God and His instruments who provided for my needs.”* Pls. continue pray for Melia, that she’ll be able to make it till graduation in high school and college.

2. **Meraly, Grade 2** – Our staff saw Meraly’s prayer in a paper she put in the cabinet. She prayed this way, *“Lord, pls. help my father to stop drinking liquor and avoid his bad friends. Pls. change him. I feel scared of him when he’s drunk. I know you love him too even he’s a drunkard.”* (Pls. include her request in your prayer time.)

Meraly is growing healthy and a little bit responsible now. She’s kind to her two younger sisters, whenever she goes home, she take care of them and shares her food and clothes to them. She improves a lot too in her studies and in Scripture Memory.

3. **Che Bergado, short term mission volunteer** – Che is from Valenzuela; a Sunday School Teacher and she’s one of the leaders in their church. She volunteered her services to Teknotropheo for almost two weeks to help us minister to the Mangyan kids. She led our Devotion and Bible Study on weekdays . And on Sunday, she handled our Children’s Sunday School. She also taught Mangyan kids new songs and dancing with tambourine. Che shared her testimony in writing...” *I will never forget my ministry experience at Teknotropheo. This was my first cross cultural mission. And I was so touched seeing the lives of Mangyan kids at Tekno Center, which is their training ground, very different from the Mangyans in their community. They were so blessed given a chance to improve their lives and most especially a chance to have lives pleasing to God. Thank God, there is Teknotropheo Mission Center! May the Workers endure serving the Mangyan Children and be more patient; your labor is not in vain....I’m blessed because I learned a lot tho’ it’s just a short term mission. I am going to share this to the children and youth of our church in Valenzuela.”*

## Ministry B: OUTREACH:

- I. MEDICAL MISSION – conducted on August 21, 2009 with Dr. Vergel Beron and his fellow doctor at Mamburao provincial hospital. We were able to give free medical consultation and medicines to one hundred ten Mangyan patients and Tagalog. Praise God for the medicines provided for this mission. Our sponsors for this endeavour were the mission team of The Vine Church and Living Word Fellowship. Their team shared the Gospel to all the patients and they accepted the Lord. They gave counsel too to Christian Mangyans.
- II. WORSHIP SERVICES – Every Sunday, average attendance is fifty Mangyan adults and thirty Mangyan children. We had four visitors; two Mangyans from other community and two Tagalogs. The members are being fed usually on Sunday only. We need a full time Pastor to minister to the members and the Church elders to help them grow in Christlikeness and disciple them to produce laborers among them.
- III. PRAYER MEETINGS – the Mangyan Church meet every morning for prayer and devotion. The average attendance is fifteen. Heren and other Church leaders lead the Prayer Meeting.
- IV. SUNDAY SCHOOL – We have regular Sunday School for adults but Sunday School for children is not yet regular because of lack of Workers.
- V. DEDICATION OF CHURCH – Last August 23,2009, we dedicated to the Lord the finished parts of the Church building with Pastor Rowel of The Vine Church and Pastor Ronald of Living Word Fellowship and with their mission teams. We still need to complete the building with the unfinished works such as ceiling of Pastoral room; painting works; plastering ; and fencing.
- VI. FELLOWSHIP in the community was held with our two churches-sponsors. We had lots of Praise and Worship singing; games and prizes. The Mangyans enjoyed much singing Praises to the Lord. They enjoyed too our games like the “palosebo”game ( climbing in a slippery bamboo) which was hardly played by male Mangyans because of the oil applied in the bamboo. The winner was Odie Canuyan’s son who lives in the mountain. They enjoyed too the food we served for them especially the ice cream. It was their first time to eat ice cream, they were so happy to taste ice cream. Nanay Conching ate the ice cream with her eyes closed because it’s so cold.

## **PRAYER REQUESTS:**

- We need more prayers in ministering to Mangyan Children. Our objectives in developing them as born again Christian Mangyans and responsible future leaders are being met in a very slow manner because we find it hard to teach them, train them and disciple them. They are like special children with special needs. However, we had seen already their potentials which needs to be developed in them for a long process. Hence, we need very extra ordinary efforts; a very long patience; and very loving compassionate hearts. These are the qualifications to be Servants of the Lord among the Mangyan Children.

Pls. help us pray for the following needs:

1. A Female Worker for the Mangyan kids with much love for poor kids and equipped in mission work; and in multi-tasking ministry;
  2. A Social Worker to help us with the kids;
  3. A Pastor for Jejireh Mangyan Village/Community equipped in God's Word and community service;
  4. Likewise, pls. pray for their monthly financial support.
- The Mangyan kids/Tekno Kids need our prayers; let's intercede for them daily; namely – Melia, Lilibeth, Maribel, Minda, Margie, Arnold, Edmund, Esmael, Joseph, Arthur, Meraly, Laila, Ethel, Jessa, Michael, Rocky, Abel, Angie, and Leny and the Grade 1 students. These kids are learning to experience how God answer their prayers. But still, they need to learn much about being Faithful, Available and Teachable children of God.
  - For our Mission building and Church building needs; pls. help us ask the Lord the following that are needed to complete it;
    1. More or less 30 gallons of paint ;
    2. Fence for rooftop which cost 50,000 pesos as estimated by the steel shop
    3. Fence for church
    4. More or less 30 bags of Cements for plastering of Church wall
    5. And fund for other finishing works.
  - For Tekno Workers
    1. Pls. pray for Herma who will end her term of service with Tekno on December 2009. Let's pray too for Geoffrey and Digna who committed to serve the Lord thru Teknotropheo after their wedding this year. Let's intercede for them as they prepare to serve God and build their family as well while in the mission.
    2. Pls. pray too for other needs of our Workers namely SSS, Philhealth, and fund for retirement; retreat for rest & recreation; personal development/training, and sabbatical leave.
